Visit to Charles Darwin Station. This is an important research facility with an extensive collection of Galapagos plant life specimens.

SANTA FE ISLAND



(Departure)





(2 hours navigation aprox.)

SOUTH PLAZA | 3 |

Created by lava that was uplifted from the sea bed, South Plaza has resident wildlife and diverse plant life.

SANTA FE | 2 |

Santa Fe Island, also called Barrington Island after British Admiral Samuel Barrington, is formed by uplifted, submarine basaltic lava, created some 4 million years' ago. A big part of this is a faulted plateau covered with a forest of giant Opuntia cactae.

What to see?

The most spectacular plants are the giant prickly pear cactae, unique to Santa Fe (Opuntia echios barringtonensis). Galapagos dove, Galapagos hawk, Sea Lion nursery, land iguanas, marine iguanas. Birds such as blue-footed, nazca boobies, swallow-tailed gulls and tropical birds.



BACHAS BEACH | 3

At this beach, you can choose to rest and/or swim in the wonderful Galapagos waters.

NORTH SEYMOUR ISLAND | 2 |

North Seymour Island is great for hiking. There is a circular path about 2 miles long that crosses the interior of the island which allows you to explore the rocky coastal path. On this trail, you will be able to discover some of the largest seabird colonies in the Galapagos Islands.

What to see?

Blue-footed boobies, bright and colorful frigatebirds, sea turtles, Galapagos sharks, sea lions.

What to do? -

Trekking, snorkeling, swimming.

SULLIVAN BAY | 3 |

Here you can see some amazing lava formations, it is the product of a volcanic eruption in 1903.

BARTHOLOMEW ISLAND | 2 |

Bartholomew is an island surrounded by turquoise waters and beautiful beaches. The island is a now extinct volcano with a variety of red, orange, green, black and shiny volcanic formations.

What to see?

Pinnacle Rock. Galapagos penguins, sea turtles, green sea turtles, sharks, white-tip reef sharks, tropical fish, sea lions and many other unique marine species.

What to do? -

Trekking, snorkeling, swimming and leisure.
