




Estancia Cerro Guido



- Low Difficulty: It is important to emphasise that, in Cerro Guido, all the hikes are on irregular terrain, often without trails or following trails marked by animals.
- Medium Difficulty: For regular walkers or occasional walkers in good physical condition.
- High Difficulty: These hikes, the most physically demanding, are intended for experienced hikers looking for a challenge. Trekking shoes and technical clothing are recommended. Walking poles are included.

Our recommendations to visit us are as follows:

- Pants: it is ideal to wear long trekking pants made of light, quick-drying fabric. Shorts are optional, they do not take up much space.
- Thermal layers: T-shirts or long-sleeved shirts are required. Short sleeve shirts optional.
- **-Thermal layers:** fleece (can be of different thickness) and down jacket (thin).
- Windproof and waterproof jacket: hopefully breathable, gore-tex for example. It is a must-have item for your walks. We do not recommend a plastic poncho: in the wind, it tears easily.
- Accessories: thin gloves and hat, scarf or buff, as temperature changes can be abrupt, even in

- them in your backpack when you go out for a walk.
- Refillable bottle (750 ml or 1 lt): to hydrate during the day and avoid disposable water bottles.
- Comfortable walking shoes. For hiking, high boots are recommended: the terrain can be quite rugged with dense vegetation, it is good to have a good sole and ankle support.

For horseback riding, a pair of sneakers or comfortable shoes not so wide they don't fit in the stirrups is sufficient.

Useful information:

How to dress? What to wear?

To fully enjoy your experience in Patagonia, we invite you to read our recommendations on what to wear.

In Patagonia, the weather is very changeable: it is not uncommon to experience all four seasons in a single day, or in just a few hours! Summer (December to March) is not very hot, with temperatures averaging 16 degrees Celsius. It can also be rainy and windy, with summer being the season of the strongest winds (over 80 km/h.).

Therefore, to enjoy your walks, it is key to have the right clothing. We recommend quick-drying, synthetic fabrics and avoid cotton and jeans: if they get wet, they keep the body cold and take a long time to dry.






Conservation Safari

In this activity, which can be done either in the morning or in the afternoon, we will learn about the work of the Cerro Guido Conservation Foundation and we will visit some of the conservation areas within the Estancia. Through observation with binoculars and trail cameras we will be able to appreciate in the field part of the fauna of the Patagonian steppe and the work that the Foundation's team carries out daily in the research of its top predator, the puma.

Conservation Safari

This excursion is not included in the All Inclusive program.

With this activity, we invite you to participate for one day in the Cerro Guido Foundation Conservation project, you will discover the diverse characteristic fauna of Patagonia and also the strategies that Estancia Cerro Guido is developing to achieve respectful livestock farming that coexists with the native species.

We leave by vehicle from the Cerro Guido Hotel at dawn, to accompany a member of our trackers team on the ground in their daily routine, we begin with the puma research work on the ranch, participating in activities such as observation with binoculars and review of camera traps. The tour includes short walks without major difficulty. Towards the end of the morning, we will discover the work of the sheep protection dogs and how they help the coexistence between conservation and human activity.

After lunch and a break, we continue in the afternoon heading to the "Casa Puma", the operations center of the Cerro Guido Conservation Foundation. There, we will watch an exciting video presentation, and then we will go out on one last field trip at sunset, where we will see the research work being carried out in the Sierra del Toro.





Sarmiento Lake Outpost - Gunther Plüschow

Through cattle fields we drive to Puesto Sarmiento, an iconic place located on the shores of the lake of the same name and bordering the Torres del Paine National Park. In the 1930's the German aviator Gunther Plüschow used Estancia Cerro Guido as a gateway for his explorations over the Patagonian mountain range and Lake Sarmiento as a base for his seaplane. During the visit to the outpost we will learn more about the life of this adventurer and we will also be able to hike and visit the lake.



Full Day Torres del Paine Northeast

This overland combines landscapes of Estancia Cerro Guido with the northeastern sector of Torres del Paine National Park. Our proximity to this protected area allows us to visit less explored areas, as well as some of the classic viewpoints of Torres del Paine.

This excursion is a mixture of driving and easy hikes that allow us to see part of Las Chinas Valley, famous for its paleontological findings, from where we will have visits to the Sierra Baguales and we will approach the Torres del Paine National Park through the Laguna Azul sector, where we will stop for lunch. During the afternoon we will drive through the northeast section of the park, an area known for the presence of wildlife and its views of the three granite Paine Towers, passing through Cañadón Macho and Paine Waterfall, an obligatory photographic stop, to begin our return to the hotel, from the Laguna Amarga sector.



Full Day Torres del Paine

Includes entrance to Torres del Paine National Park

This excursion will take us on roads that cover part of the 1814 km2 of Torres del Paine National Park. From views of the Southern Ice Field to the pampa and its fauna, we will explore the diverse landscapes this biosphere reserve offers.

We leave the ranch towards Lago del Toro to approach Torres del Paine National Park from the south, where we will have a panoramic view of its mountains, forests, lakes and glaciers. We enter the park through the Serrano river entrance and continue to the Pingo river sector for a short hike to Grey Lake. Then we continue to Lake Pehoé to have lunch and visit the Salto Grande, one of the most scenic places in the park. In the afternoon, we will visit the eastern sector of the park, passing by the viewpoint of Lake Nördenskjold and Lake Sarmiento, to our last stop at Paine Waterfall and return to Cerro Guido from Laguna Amarga.





Horseback Riding

Macizo Paine Lookout

This ride is a must for beginner riders or those who simply want to enjoy the natural beauty that surrounds our ranch. We leave from our stable to the upper part of the ranch. This route takes us through a smooth level plain with the majestic Torres del Paine always in sight.

On the way out we border a forest of lengas and ñirres, native trees of Patagonia. On the way back, we cross meadows and open fields where it is common to see native fauna such as guanacos, rheas and foxes, as well as horses and sheep.



Caravana

We will go through the fields surrounding our stable, where it is common to see animals of the Estancia, such as sheep and horses, as well as natuve funa such as guanacos, all of this accompained by open views of the vast Patagonian steppe.

With a view of Sierra Baguales in the ditance, we continue up the slope of Sierra Contreras. For the return through the Estancia, we have Torres del Paine on the horizon. 
Laguna Tegualda

(From January)

This ride take us through the inmensity of the patagonian steppe. We leave towards the lower part of the estancia in the direction of the Tegualda Lagoon, a nice place for bird watching, it is common to see groups of flamingos, ducks, geese and rheas among others. Surrounded by Sierra del Cazador, Sierra Baguales and the Paine Massif, this ride through the pampa invites experienced riders to practice trotting and galloping.

Segunda Barranca

Varied in landscapes and all types of terrain, this ride begins by going up from our stable to the upper part of Sierra Contreras, from where we head to the Segunda Barranca sector, an old ranch thattoday is part of Cerro Guido. Continuing west, we will slowly enter a native Nothofagus forest. After lunch, we return through a sector of open pampa, joined by the presence of wildlife and the Torres del Paine as a backdrop.



Our experienced riders looking for exitement and natural beauty will love this ride, the longest and fastest we offer. First, we ride towards the lower Part of the ranch, through plains and meadows. Then, we head towards the Las Flores sector, with Sierra Baguales looking more magnificent as we advance. After lunch, we return through the upper part of the ranch, this time with the Paine Massif in sight. Throughout the route, there are extensive streches for trotting and galloping.

Sarmiento Lake



Located within the Torres del Paine National Park, Sarmiento lake is the largest in this nature reserve and is bordered to the east by Estancia Cerro Guido. This hike takes place near the base of Sierra del Toro, from where we descend slowly through the steppe until we reach the lake's southeast shore, where we will have a great panoramic view of the Paine Massif. There, we will be able to appreciate the thrombolites; calcium carbonate deposits that are typical of Sarmiento lake, and then return by a short and slightly steep climb.

Bosquecito Lookout



This walk offers the chance to leave by foot from the hotel itself and discover the natural beauty that surrounds our ranch at your own pace. Doing a continuous climb alongside of a beautiful stream surrounded by lengas, a native tree of Patagonia, you will reach the viewpoint where you can enjoy athe scenery, in particular the majestic Torres del Paine and Lake Sarmiento. The walk has the advantage of having numerous viewpoints, so the final destination will depend on how far you want to walk. The tour is ideal for observing the distinctive Patagonian fauna such as guanacos, rheas and foxes.

Sierra Baguales lookout



Shorter but more demanding, this excursion is a short version of our full day hike to Sierra Baguales, where we will visit Puesto de Las Flores, near the border with Argentina, to make a short but steep ascent to a viewpoint that will place us in front of the Tridente and Ciudadela mountains, some of the most imposing

peaks of this mountain range. We will also have a view of the extensive pampa that extends to the east, and then begin our descent through one of the valleys that will take us back to the starting point.

Las Chinas Lookout



Off the beaten path, enthusiast adventurers will love this hike. We leave Cerro Guido hotel by car, a 40-minute drive to the Valle de Las Chinas, a wild and seldom explored place located in the northeast sector of the ranch.

Our walk takes us through open fields, following the Las Chinas River to the only forest in the valley, composed of lengas and ñirres, native trees of Patagonia. There, we begin our ascent to the viewpoint, located on top of the hills.

The climb is challenging, off the trail and over uneven terrain. Still, our efforts are rewarded when we reach a stunning viewpoint, not only for its spectacular views of the Torres del Paine and surroundings but also for its mineral environment and peculiar rock formations that will transport us to other times.

Chenque Cerro Guido Lookout



An exciting challenge for our hikers, climbing the highest peak of the Sierra Contreras and the hill that gives our ranch its name. At 1270m high, you will discover an exceptional panorama and a valuable archaeological monument, the Chenque, great burial mound erected by the Aonikenk, an ancient native people of Patagonia, now extinct.

We leave the hotel on foot, climbing continuously through open fields until we reach the foot of the Sierra Contreras mountains. Here comes an arduous climb up the steep slope of the hill, on rocky terrain and with no path, to a first plateau, where a great view of Sierra Baguales rewards our efforts. To reach the summit of Cerro Guido, where the famous Chenque is located, we continue our ascent across another large inclined plateau a more progressive and smoother climb. A spectacular, 360 degree view awaits us, sweeping across the surrounding valleys, mountains, lakes and glaciers, with Torres del Paine in sight.

Base of the Towers Lookout

This is one of Patagonia's classic hikes and the main attraction of the national park. Every year backpackers from all over the world put themselves to the test in this intense challenge. For those who want to spend a day in the mountains of Torres del Paine, this experience will definitely be worth it.

We leave early from the hotel to head to Torres del Paine
National Park, where we will begin our hike approaching the
Macizo Paine and facing the first big climb of 2 km.

That will take us inside the Ascencio Valley. We continue through the valley, passing by the Chilean Camp and gradually climbing through a forest until we reach the foot of the glacier moraine that rises to the viewpoint of the towers. Probably the most challenging, the last hour of steep climbing and rocky terrain leads us to contemplate one of the most iconic landscapes of Patagonia.

The diversity of landscapes; forests, lakes, mountain ranges and hanging glaciers, make this full day trekking the ideal excursion for nature and adventure lovers.

We start departing from the hotel by vehicle early in the morning, which takes us to Pudeto dock, where we board a catamaran that crosses the glacial waters of the famous Lake Pehoé, to the Paine Grande mountain hut, at the foot of the mountain of the same name, where we begin our hike. Passing through a variety of landscapes and with a gentle slope we arrive at the Italiano Camp. From there, with a steeper slope, we continue walking into the valley, through a dense forest of lenga and coihue trees overlooking an impressive hanging glacier, until we reach the French viewpoint.

A place surrounded by granite walls where you can enjoy one of the most incredible views of the park.

Sierra Baguales



One of the most iconic landscapes of the estancia, the mystical Sierra Baguales is the natural boundary between Chile and Argentina, as well as the site of recent paleontological and archeological discoveries. The solitary and wild nature of this little explored mountain range is a must for adventure enthusiasts. For this excursion we head towards Puesto Las Flores, where we start a steep ascent, off trail, that will take us through hills

covered with coiron to base of the Sierra Baguales. A series of small lakes, striking peaks and herds of guanacos are part of the breathtaking scenery that accompanies us as we approach Cerro Ciudadela. We descend through wide valleys, where you can still see herds of baguales; wild horses that inspired the name of this remote mountain range.



Estancia Cultural Tour

Our guided tour is an invitation to discover an authentic patagonian ranch, where not only the original buildings with valuable testimonies of the region's architectural heritage have been preserved, but also the traditional lifestyle that defines the very essence of Patagonia. This tour through the center of the ranch, founded more than 100 years ago, is a true journey through time.

We start with the presentation of the map of the province and a historical introduction to the cattle activity in Patagonia. After that, we walk through different areas of the ranch, such as the orchard and the greenhouse, where we can try some of their products to finally visit the manor house and the shearing shed if the season allows it.

Paleontology Valle las Chinas



The Las Chinas River Valley and its impressive fossil record has been studied for more than 20 years by different teams of paleon-tologists. Their discoveries have made it the most important paleontological site in Chile and key to understanding the end of the dinosaur era.

The excursion takes us to the interior of the Las Chinas Valley, the heart of the paleontological findings, a remote and difficult to access place, but with unique nature and landscapes. This sector and its sedimentary rock formations are an uninterrupted record of the last 20 million years of the dinosaur era and the first 3 million years of the mammal era, which represents an open book to understanding what our planet was like 80 million years ago. In this adventure we will follow in the footsteps of paleontologists and explore in our all-terrain vehicles one of the least visited places of Estancia Cerro Guido.



Sparsely populated and with water sources that descend directly from glaciers and mountains, Patagonia and its crystal-clear rivers are one of the most pristine places in the world to fish.
