





All excursions are subject to availability and weather conditions, so we recommend you book in advance. All Inclusive guests can choose any excursion, subject to availability, at no extra cost. Our team at Las Torres Reserve is waiting to give you a warm welcome and ensure that your stay in the Eighth Wonder of the World is truly unforgettable.







Walk along the foothills of Mount Almirante Nieto, where the combination of the breeze and the view will make your soul feel alive. Granite peaks stand in the distance as you follow the trail along the steep slopes of the Ascencio Valley. Lush trees and vegetation line the river below and your sight extends to the end of the valley, giving you a full view of the hike ahead. You'll enter a native lenga forest and eventually hit a rocky area, which represents the final, yet hardest, section of the trail.

You have the option to do this activity completely on foot. With either option, the excursion starts at the Hotel to quickly take the ascending trail up the Ascencio Valley, passing through a beautiful Lenga forest until it reaches a rocky area. The route crosses icy streams that originate in the glaciers high above and winds through rocks that can be challenging to pass. Your reward at the top is the view of the magnificent Torres del Paine and your reflection in the lagoon below.






Take a breathtaking hike between the ominous Mount Almirante Nieto and the ice blue north shore of Lake Nordenskjöld. As you walk along the lake, pristine streams fed by hanging glaciers slash across the rocky trail leading you to the Cuernos sector. You'll cross a hanging bridge over the Arriero River, make a stop to see the deep blue Inge Lagoon, and see moon-like rock and land formations. Located just below a cluster of jagged peaks called Los Cuernos, this area offers incredible, contrasting views of the Lake Nordenskjöld, towering granite peaks, and a thick, deep green treeline. You'll likely see the whirlwind that look like little tornadoes buzzing from one part of the lake to another.

Hike part of the O Circuit trail around the eastern edge of the massif, into a magical old-growth lenga forest. One of Patagonia's iconic trees, the *Nothofagus pumilio* thrives in areas with low temperatures and heavy snow. Lenga woodland provides a habitat for many animals and if you keep your eyes peeled, you have a good chance at spotting Carpinteros (Magellanic Woodpeckers), Cachañas (Austral Parakeet), Pitios (Chilean Flicker) and other forest birds. Although it is unlikely to see them during the day, the presence of pumas, which are known to roam this forest, is likely. You'll walk along the foothills of Cerro Paine, crossing little streams and arrive at a gorgeous valley that is filled with daisies during spring. Finishing with a walk along the turquoise Paine River, you'll enjoy the deep visual contrast of forest and pampas. The trail also features great views of Azul Lagoon, Guido Mountain, and the Sierra Baguales Range on the eastern side of the Massif.




This tour combines the Park's "must see" with a special twist. Horseback riding in Torres del Paine offers a unique and exhilarating experience. Begin the day in the stables, learning about the horses, and then start your ride across typical Patagonian lands of low vegetation along the trail that borders the Ascencio Valley.

You can let the horse walk freely and instinctively, and lose yourself in the impressive, mesmerizing views of the valley. When you reach the Chileno Mountain Hostel, you'll leave the horses to rest while they patiently wait for you to climb up to the Las Torres Base Viewpoint. After crossing a dense forest, you'll hit a rocky trail that eventually leads you through a moraine of huge rocks and reveals the highly anticipated granite towers. Here we'll take time to process the magnificent sight, eat lunch, and take the iconic photo of the three peaks soaring over the Glacial lagoon.



This celebrated lake at the foot of the Paine Massif is named after Otto Nordenskjöld (1869-1928), a Finnish-Swedish explorer who probed much of the Antarctic, Greenland, Chile and Peru in the early 20th century. Starting out from the hotel, the excursion follows part of the famous “W” Trail that stretches between the lake’s gorgeous north shore and Monte Almirante Nieto, the glacier and snow-covered mountain which anchors the southeastern extreme of the Paine Massif. Although the routes are slightly different for horse and hikers, the scenery and terrain are very similar. The equestrian version includes numerous stream and river crossings and offers a chance to learn more about Patagonian horses, baqueanos and culture, whilst improving your skills on a saddle.



Ride towards the valley on the little-known trails that the colonists and baqueanos used in Patagonia's early days. You'll look up at imposing rock walls and a spectacular view of the Las Torres Mountains, while feeling truly connected to the horse and the environment around you. Skirting the slopes of Mount Paine, we'll make a stop to enjoy the landscape, where you'll note a unique microclimate and distinct vegetation. After the valley, you'll have glorious views of Mount Almirante Nieto and feel the serenity of Lake Nordenskjöld. If you're lucky, you'll see traces of puma as you pass by the "Puma Cave" on the way back to the stables. Guided by our baqueanos, riders of all levels will love getting a glimpse into the culture and heart of Patagonia.




If you have previous experience in horseback riding, the Enchanted Valley tour is for you! Feel the Patagonian wind in your face and the adrenaline in your body as you gallop across the pampas. You will follow the original path used by the baqueanos, and spend a whole day immersed in their culture. Along a winding river and at the foot of the imposing peaks, we guarantee that you will be enchanted by the nature that will surround you.

On this equestrian adventure through the Las Torres Reserve, you will also pass through a native forest of lenga trees, which are home to thousands of birds, including the Carpinteros (Magellanic Woodpeckers), Cachañas (Austral Parakeet), Pitios (Chilean Flicker).


The trip follows the O Circuit along the eastern side of the Paine Massif and into the Paine River valley. You will have excellent views of Azul Lagoon and Mount Cerro Paine before arriving at the Serón Camping in the Enchanted Valley.

🕒 BAQUEANO CULTURAL EXPERIENCE

Spend a morning with the baqueanos and get a glimpse of the traditional Patagonian lifestyle. During your time with these Patagonian cowboys and girls — descendants of horsemen who came to work ranches in this remote region more than a century ago — you will learn about their special clothing, saddles and other horse tack. They can show you how to properly saddle a horse, nail a horseshoe and, of course, how to ride!

The baqueanos will be happy to take a break, share a mate, and proudly tell you about their culture. Mate, a herbal tea made from yerba mate leaves, is heavily woven into Patagonia's lifestyle and sharing this hot beverage is a beloved tradition with high significance. Enjoy have a savory treat of sopaipillas with pebre, a classic Chilean combination of pumpkin bread and fresh salsa. By the end of this cowboy experience, you will have a much better understanding of what it was like to live and work in this remote corner of South America before the arrival of tourism.

REGENERATIVE KITCHEN GARDEN



They say necessity is the mother of all inventions. When the Kusanovic Family took over the property, they immediately began cultivating their own herbs, fruits and vegetables. Today, our garden has developed immensely since its origin in the early 1950s and is now one of the region's largest regenerative gardens.

Within about a half hectare, one of the world's southernmost regenerative gardens produces seasonal fruits and vegetables using bio-intensive, sustainable methods. We aim to strike a balance between conserving heirloom varieties and meeting production goals. Many of the ingredients found in our restaurant dishes and bar cocktails come directly from the garden!

Our garden is part of our long-term strategy to leave the smallest possible footprint within the National Park and just one example of the Las Torres Reserve's commitment to sustainable tourism.



This is the easiest and most comfortable of our activities. It is designed to see the famous Torres del Paine from 3 different perspectives, passing through the middle of the Patagonian pampas in a vehicle. Here you will visit the Paine Waterfall, where you will have a privileged view of the Almirante Nieto Glacier and Las Torres. The second stop will be at Laguna Azul where you will be able to see the Paine Massif and Las Torres in all their splendor, a perfect place to understand the geological origin of the sector.

In addition, a friendly walk along the coast of Laguna Azul and finally, the classic stop at Laguna Amarga, which is characterized for being a glacial remnant with its geological richness due to the stromatolites.

This trip in the Patagonian steppe opens doors to the observation of wildlife, both species associated with the pampas, such as the guanaco, condor and raptors, as well as waterfowl associated with brackish lagoons characteristic of these sectors.





Start with a drive to Pudeto and fall in love with the magic of nature as you see trees sprouting new life. The view of the Paine Massif above Lake Nordenskjöld is truly breathtaking. You'll visit the Salto Grande Waterfall, a raging cascade that channels water between the Nordenskjöld and Pehoé Lakes. With renewed energy, you'll continue along a path to one of the most humbling views in Torres del Paine National Park, a panorama that features the Los Cuernos Mountains, Mount Paine Grande, and the Francés Valley with its glacier rising straight up from the other side of Lake Nordenskjöld. It is hands down a breathtaking spectacle.




PATAGÓN



The day starts at 7:45 am. leaving from the hotel, where you will take a van that will take you to the Sarmiento gate of the National Park. Then you will walk 9.5 km on a mostly flat terrain, crossing the pampas, where you will understand ancient geological processes that have shaped this world biosphere reserve, finding records of the first inhabitants of these lands. It is a protected territory that you can only enter with certified guides where you can find Aonikenk rock paintings, as well as a great wildlife activity, with a high presence of birds of prey and scavengers; and mammals such as guanacos and pumas.



LAKES TRAIL



Get a different take on the Torres del Paine flora and fauna – and a dramatically different view of the mountain. As soon as your eyes hit the first lake, you'll want to get out and take photos immediately. You'll see a lot of wildlife as we drive alongside the intense blue of Lake Sarmiento, one of the largest in the Park, and as we move away from the Paine Massif, you'll get an incredible panoramic perspective of its immensity. Making a stop at the nearby agricultural Estancia Lazo Ranch, you'll see Verde Lagoon and start hiking the Lakes Trail. First, you'll wander through big, thick forests of native lenga trees, which open up for breaks along the beautiful shores of the Verde and Honda Lagoons. Be on the lookout for owls, woodpeckers, guanaco and other wildlife, and don't miss out on the tiny details like orchids and other wildflowers that decorate the forest floor. We'll temporarily change water for mountains and climb to a summit with a 360° view of the Paine Massif to the north and Lake Toro and endless Patagonian pampas to the southwest.

This tour gives you a beautiful taste of all Torres del Paine National Park has to offer. Travel comfortably in a van that stops at all the main sights, letting you get out and take short hikes to outstanding lookouts. In one day, you'll get to see almost all the Park's must-sees and you'll have a terrific view of the entire Paine Massif.

Stops along the way include Black Bridge, Nordenskjöld Lookout, Sarmiento Lookout, Lake Pehoé and the Salto Grande Waterfall. Generally, you'll have lunch during the sailing trip (departing at 1pm). In exceptional cases, you take a later sailing trip and have lunch before. All guests who take the sailing trip must walk to the beach (departing area) and will see icebergs. If you don't go on the sailing trip, you can take an easy walk to the Peninsula for approximately 1.5 hrs instead.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The boat trip is not mandatory and is not included in our all-inclusive programs (ask for prices without navigation).

The catamaran has capacity for 100 people and the navigation has a total duration of approximately 3 hours. It is offered by an external company and, therefore, we can't take responsibility for cancellations due to weather or technical issues.

Modifications to the boat tour are subject to reservation policies of the company "Lago Grey". Read more in our "Tour Modification and Cancellation Policies".

A minimum of 15 people is required in March and April.


The French Valley Tour will take us into the depths of the mountain and venture through the famous French Valley, in the heart of the Torres del Paine National Park and the famous W Circuit.


Begin by navigating the shimmering Lake Pehoé to Paine Grande, where you will go along the north side of Lake Skottsberg until you reach the beginning of the valley road.

You will climb up a steep trail and when you are deep in the valley, you will feel the full moment as the powerful energy of the forest flows through you. When you emerge from the tree zone you will encounter a new landscape: the breathtaking view of Los Cuernos on one side and on the other the French Glacier hanging from the Paine Grande mountain.

This active glacier gives you the opportunity to hear and see when it creaks and cracks.

Before you leave, don't forget to look back! The lakes below are the finishing touch to this panoramic view. Here, you will witness 360 degrees of the Nordenskjöld, Pehoé and Toro lakes and the Paine Grande, Hoja, Máscara, Espada, Fortaleza and Aleta de Tiburon mountains.





CONDITIONS FOR MODIFYING AND CANCELLING TOURS

October 2025 to April 2026

Reservation Conditions:

- Tours can be reserved until 8pm the day before departure at the Hotel.
- It is the guest's responsibility to approach our Excursion Center to book their chosen tours.
- All tours are subject to availability and weather conditions. Tours within the Las Torres Patagonia require a minimum of four guests. Tours outside the Reserve require a minimum of six guests. All tours will be confirmed at 7pm, at the latest, the day before departure.
- Full day tours include a sandwich and snacks.

Boat Trip:

- The "Full Paine" tour have optional boat trip that are carried out by external company and require pre-bookings due to limited space (without change of date). Reservation modifications are subject to the policies of the company Lago Grey: Grey Glacier boat trip: a minimum of fifteen guests is required.
- Boat trip must be requested from our sale executives or directly at the Hotel at least seven days in advance.


Cancellation And Modification Policies:

- Cancellations made twenty-four hours before a tour departs will receive a 100% refund.

- Cancellations made less than twenty-four hours before a tour departs will be considered "no shows" and there is no refund. The free cancellation period changes to 4 days for the Full Paine / Grey Glacier.
- If a service provider decides to cancel a tour due to weather, it will be re-booked for the following days. If there is no availability, the affected party will receive a 100% refund on the cost of the navigation.

Modifications:

Tours can be modified free of charge until 8pm the day before departure. If a modification is made for a more expensive tour, the difference will be charged. If a modification is made for a less expensive tour, the difference will not be refunded unless it is made at least twenty four hours before departure. Modifications of "Full Paine" tours must be made four days before departure in order from receive a refund on the navigation.
